- >> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: I'm great wow the Queen extraordinaire I love that maybe I'll add that to my website I really appreciate that.

- >> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: It's really great so anyone who knows me knows I have been an avid Verizon and Samsung user for a really long time now.

So it felt like a real partnership it felt pretty natural this phone really it is an amazing phone it has a new night mode camera which is great I'm a creature of the night I wake up at the crack of noon by the time I wake up the sun is already on its way down so the night mode camera is really great especially for me I'm a comedian I'm a drag queen and a late nighter so that's a really great feature for me personally.

>> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: There were like five drag queens who wanted to go to Times Square and yell about our lack of rights.

And we did it for a little over a year we did it until marriage equality in New York which felt really great to have and then of course it was Federally recognized.

And you know, I ended up -- I started doing that just because I found out some things that felt like injustice to me at that time that felt like the most effective way for me to enact change.

As you get older and as things change and your status changes if there's a way to enact change some people it will be protesting some people it's legislature for other people it's influencing.

There's lots of people.

Everyone has like a different, you know, position in the battle for equal rights.

>> ADI WINELAND: Yeah; yeah.

And I know you had kind of talked about how you were in Albany when gay marriage was legalized.

You got arrested in drag.

What was all of that like?

>> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: So when I got arrested in drag it was really emotional we were at Bryant Park about a block over from Times Square we knew we were going to get arrested the plan was to cause a scene and get arrested to get national coverage for marriage equality and in Albany it was pretty intense too there were so many people there so much passion from both sides actually and listening in and we were tired and we were hungry we were emotional we were crying we were angry you know hopeful.

Upset.

All of that rolled into one.

And plus I was really young.

I think -- I don't even know how old I was, I was in my early 20s.

Which I am not right now.

(Chuckles).

>> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: I am a little far from that at this point in my life. And you know, it really did feel like it just felt -- it was just a very emotional time in my life.

And ever since then I've just kind of been interested in enacting political change or helping push forward political change.

>> ADI WINELAND: So one quote that has always kind of stood out to me that you said on your season of Drag Race was: Find something you love about yourself and focus on that.

And I think that was just such a powerful kind of empowering message, self-love. Having confidence in yourself.

And I'm wondering if since then did that comment resonate with anyone? Did people reach out to you about how that kind of impacted them?

>> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: You remember that all the way from when you were 16?

Were you in like home -- like home economics or math class being like that's right, Bob.

- >> ADI WINELAND: Well, I'll admit I remember the general paraphrased version. I went and checked the real one a couple of days ago.
- >> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: Well, you know, I actually got that from a friend named -- I don't know where they got it from but I heard it from a friend -- my friend Larry Darnell Penn Whitfield was an active and humorous and singer in New York City and I went to their show I remember them saying find the one thing you love for yourself and for me -- if you have one nice tooth you say to yourself man, this is a really nice tooth.

I love this tooth.

Then maybe you can learn to love the tooth next to it and then the gums and then the lips and then your face and then your head and then your shoulders and then your body.

>> ADI WINELAND: Well thank you so much, Bob, for being here, for spreading your positive energy with the V Team.

Everyone is going to love watching this.

Do you have any last words for the V Team?

>> BOB THE DRAG QUEEN: I'm just very grateful.

And maybe I'll see you, you know, around.
